- The European Roma Rights Centre (ERRC) is an international public interest law organization based in Budapest that works to combat anti-Romani racism and human rights abuse of Roma through strategic litigation, research and policy development, advocacy and human rights education.
- The organization has consultative status with the Council of Europe, as well as with the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations, and has been the recipient of numerous awards for its efforts to advance human rights respect of Roma.
- ERRC concerns itself with Roma issues across Europe, from as far West as France to as east as Turkey, and works in a variety of European languages, though it publishes in English.


